## Course in First Aid Management of Anaphylaxis



The Ministerial Order 90 Anaphylaxis Management in Schools sets out clearly what steps schools must, at a minimum, take to ensure the safety of students at risk of anaphylaxis in their care.

The approved provider of a service must ensure that at all times that while children are being educated and cared for by the service, at least one educator must hold a current approved first aid qualification and have undertaken current approved anaphylaxis management training. Asthma management training is required by 1 January 2013.

- Causes and recognition of Anaphylaxis
- Management of Anaphylaxis
  - Scenario Management
- Administration of Adrenaline Auto injector
- Develop risk minimisation and management strategies
  - Identifying at risk individuals and developing management plans
  - Implementing prevention strategies
  - Developing communication plan to raise awareness



### Qualification

- A nationally recognised statement of attainment will be issued to all successful applicants
- An annual refresher is recommended

### Duration

4 hours face-to-face training

### Prerequisites

There are no prerequisite units. Participants should have numeracy and literacy skills equivalent to level 2 of the National reporting System

### Assessment methods

Progressive assessment throughout the course. Includes the demonstration of practical skills and answering of written/oral questions
