



22579VIC- Course in Verifying the correct use of Adrenaline Injector devices

Clause 12 of Ministerial Order 706 requires school staff to undertake regular training in anaphylaxis management as part of the school anaphylaxis management policy.

The Department has moved to an online model for anaphylaxis training. Under this model it is recommended that all Victorian school staff undertake the online training course. The online training course will be free to all Victorian school staff (and the general public) and can be accessed on ASCIA's website

Please note: in order to successfully complete this training staff will also be required to show the school anaphylaxis supervisor that they are able to appropriately and competently use an adrenaline autoinjector. This capability must be tested within 30 days of completion of the online training course.

School anaphylaxis supervisor role must hold the following qualifications:

Currency in the Course in Verifying the Correct Use of Adrenaline Injector Devices 225579VIC (This Course) and the ASCIA Anaphylaxis e-training for Victorian Schools (every 2 years)

Course Content

- Prepare for verification activity
- Verify the candidate with reference to school Supervisors' observation checklist
- Complete required documentation

Qualification

A nationally recognised statement of attainment will be issued to all successful applicants, valid for 3 years.

Duration

2hours face-to-face training (or via Virtual Meeting)

Prerequisites

- ASCIA Anaphylaxis e-training for Victorian Schools
- 22578VIC Course in first aid management of anaphylaxis

Assessment methods

Progressive assessment throughout the course. Includes the demonstration of practical skills and answering of written/oral questions
